# Burke Shire Flood Update



Please be cautious when moving about the community because although the floodwater has receded, there could be concealed hazards and other dangers that cannot be seen.

## Repatriation

We are currently planning repatriation flights for community members that have previously been evacuated. This will occur in a staged approach. We are hoping to have our first evacuees returned later this week. Once a schedule is in place, evacuees will be contacted directly.

## **Burketown Roads Update**

- The roads at Beames Street (Outside Nowlands/Post office) and the intersection of Anthony and Burke Street have now been repaired
- The road to the Airport is currently **open to restricted vehicles only.** There is road damage that needs to be repaired.
- The roads and bridge inspectors are conducting inspections and assessments today and tomorrow. Once roads can be reopened, road reports will be released in line with updates.
- The road towards Leichhardt Falls (towards the Albert River Bridge) is closed to all traffic. The road has suffered severe damage and repairs need to be undertaken before it will be accessible.

If you notice other hazards in the community, please contact Council as a matter of priority.

#### Gregory

- Professional Cleaners will be in Gregory and the Bidunggu Community later in the week to do the initial cleaning of the homes affected by flooding.
- As per the road report released Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> March, the road between Burke and Wills and Gregory has now reopened.

#### Power update:

Power has now been restored to most properties. An electrical contractor is currently based in Burketown and will continue to work to restore any remaining power.

#### Water and Sewerage update:

Water and Sewerage services have now been restored to normal operations.

#### <u>Airport</u>

- Gregory airport is now operational.
- Burketown airport has been reopened with restriction. Aircraft with a maximum of 7.5T can access the airstrip.

#### Rubbish update:

Rubbish collection will continue as per normal arrangements:

- Gregory Thursdays
- Burketown Fridays

Please ensure wheelie bins are roadside for collection.

## **Resupply update:**

Resupply is scheduled for Friday 31 March for Burketown and Gregory. Contact will made to businesses and rural properties. More information will be released to the public closer to the date.

## **Community Facilities:**

- The gym has now been cleaned and is open to the public. Please be mindful of the uneven ground surface as carpet was removed and there are no treadmills currently operational due to flooding. Repair and replacement of equipment will take place in the near future.
- Due to flooding and clean up required the Burketown playground is closed until further notice.

## Clean up

## **Funding and Support**

There are a number of disaster funds that have been activated as a result of flooding. Please note it is advised to keep all recovery cost receipts and photos of damage for future potential grants and claims. The main grants currently open are listed below:

- Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment one-off payment of \$1000 per eligible adult and \$400 per eligible child who have suffered a significant loss as a result of the floods, including a severely damaged or destroyed home or a serious injury.
- <u>Disaster Recovery Allowance (DRA)</u> is available to employees or sole traders who work or live in the LGAs of Boulia, Burke, Carpentaria, Cloncurry, Doomadgee, Mornington and Mount Isa. <a href="https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/natural-disaster-events?context=60042">https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/natural-disaster-events?context=60042</a>
- <u>Emergency Hardship Assistance Grant</u> \$180 per adult and \$900 for a family of five is still available and will be available until the 6th April. To register for this, apply online or over the phone -
